Whether or not you believe in ghosts, the Halloween season is the time to "get into the spirit" and discover the paranormal history and folk lore of the Tallahassee area.

Monticello, Florida, a town about 25 miles east of Tallahassee, is said to be the most haunted small town in the southeast. From the earliest days of Monticello, stories have circulated of mysterious lights in the cemetery, doors opening and closing by unseen hands, ghostly faces appearing in long abandoned houses, and the sound of eerie footsteps or strains of music from a long ago party.



Guides from the Big Bend Ghost Trackers estimate that one out of every three homes and businesses in Monticello has been or is currently haunted by spirits like those of abandoned brides and eccentric doctors.

For some of us, it's scary enough just driving at night on the desolate, unlit stretch of Highway 90 between Tallahassee and Monticello. But if you want to soak up local culture, get caught up in Halloween and contribute to the betterment of society, consider taking the 90-minute night tour.

Tours operate all year long, however, each October the ghost tours are dedicated to the chamber of commerce for community improvement and they receive 50% of all October tour proceeds.

In addition, a 75- minute ghost hunt is also available. Equipped with flashlights, thermometers, cameras, hand-held electronic devices that communicate with spirits and infrared equipment, you'll feel like you're on the set of a Ghost Busters film.

Not to be outdone, Tallahassee also offers a walking tour of ghostly sites, but only in late October. It's a more light-hearted tour, with costumed guides who make the experience "family friendly."

The 45-minute tours will depart on the half hour between 6:30pm and 9:30pm from Andrew's Capital Grill & Bar, 228 S. Adams Street on Friday, October 23, Saturday, October 24 and Sunday, October 25. The tour concludes at the Old City Cemetery.

Looking for something to do with the kids the week before Halloween? Why not take a tour of some of the local, Tallahassee area farms?

This year marks the 8th consecutive year that local Tallahassee area farms open their doors to you and I for a farm fresh experience! Twenty-eight farms are opening their doors and inviting you and the entire family to experience farm life.

Bought a dairy farm



Each farm is offering something special. Families can enjoy tours that include barnyard animals, farm-fresh goods and refreshments. You can also attend a workshop on beekeeping, take a hayride, or talk to farmers who are committed to organic production.

Visit working cattle and goat ranches, a dairy or a winery. And of course, purchase amazingly fresh goods directly from the farm. This is a great opportunity for adults and kids to learn about all that goes into producing the food that we eat every day.

If you're a $1^{\rm st}$ timer, make sure you bring the following essentials to make the

most of your farm tours: a map or smart phone with GPS navigation, water, sunscreen, a cooler (you will be able to buy produce, eggs, meat and other products at the farms), closed-toe shoes, and cash (not all farms accept credit cards).

And finally, there are some rules that the farmers ask you to follow while on tour: please do not bring pets, do not visit the farms before or after their set hours, do not enter the private homes, but most of all...Have Fun!!!

I would plan your day in advance as you will need to pick out the farms you want to see, find them on a map, and determine your route (as well as how many stops you want to make).

A good tip when narrowing down the list of farms you want to see is to try to keep them within a reasonable distance of each other ... you'll thank yourself at the end of the day!

Tallahassee's Own Butterfly Effect

One of the best things about Tallahassee in October is the arrival of thousands of Monarch Butterflies as they pass through the St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge on their journey to Mexico (yes, that's right – about 2000 miles around the coast of Florida and other gulf coast states to the mountains of Mexico where they spend their winters).

To celebrate the annual migration and the arrival of thousands of the butterflies who stop by for a meal, the SMNWR holds a festival the 4th Saturday every October. They give guided auto tours, invite exhibitors and have Monarch experts on hand to answer questions.

Different from other wildlife migrations where parents lead the way, these guys are guided by an inherited behavior pattern. The Monarchs use cold fronts to facilitate their travel, moving between 10 and 30 MPH, covering about 75 miles a day, and weighing only 1 gram!

Goldenrod and Saltbush, both blooming around the lighthouse, attract them in really large numbers as they stock up on the energy they need for their long trip.

The amazing thing about these butterflies is how they actually complete the migration when the adults only live for 30 days. The life cycle of the butterflies is repeated several times over a summer with the immature butterflies eating and growing until they reach their adult phase when they disperse and reproduce.

Female Monarchs will deposit as many as 400 eggs on the underside of plant

leaves and the eggs will hatch in 1-4 days. That cycle will repeat until the days get shorter and temperatures drop at which point the juveniles' hormones prompt the extension of their lives from 30 days to 6-9 months, triggering the monarchs to migrate instead of reproduce!

There has been great fascination with the Monarch Butterfly migrations for many years. Hoping to follow the monarchs along their journey to Mexico, volunteers have been tagging butterflies that land at St. Marks.



You can join the tagging effort by <u>calling</u> <u>the SMNWR</u> and volunteering to help on one of the Saturdays leading up to the butterfly festival.

The festival itself is filled with wonderful activities, including a live butterfly tent which gives one the opportunity to hold a Monarch Butterfly in their hands. Other opportunities include making butterfly crafts, learning more about the butterfly from researchers and much much more!

The longer I live in Tallahassee, the more I love this place!

This combat veteran-centric, non-profit organization was created by Marine Captain Danny Maher (medically retired) with Marine Sergeant Ryan Loya. The group uses humor and camaraderie to help fellow combat veterans deal with the stresses of post-combat lives.

In his words, Capt Maher explains, "We are combat veterans who choose to tell our stories in the same manner that we'd tell them in a living room with our best bros. We choose to express our dark humor and let our terrible jokes fly like eagles, all in an effort to get combat vets to laugh, get together, and stop killing themselves."

The Irreverant Warriors will be bringing this intentional inappropriateness to the streets of Tallahassee on October 3, by sponsoring a 22k hike starting on Walker Street and ending on Gaines Street. The first event was held in San Diego last July, but has expanded to many other major cities including Houston, Minneapolis, Atlanta, and now Tallahassee.

Civilians and non-combat vets are invited and strongly encouraged to participate, though the focus of the march is the combat veteran. It is a day long hike with multiple stops at various watering holes.

It's going to be one heck-of-a-time for participants and onlookers as scantily clad warriors march through the streets of Tallahassee. It's a sight you are going to have to see to believe.
