Golden Eagle: Something FORE! Everyone

The gated, golf-course community of Golden Eagle Plantation is located in northeast Tallahassee, about 10 miles south of the Georgia border and 12 miles north of downtown.

Various levels of Country Club membership are offered, and it's easy to see how the championship course is often the magnet that attracts its residents.

The golf course, designed by <u>Tom</u> <u>Fazio</u>, is the jewel in the crown of this upscale community. It offers beautiful scenery, a variety of challenges - water, sand, trees, sloping terrain - and even an island tee.

There are four state of the art clay surface tennis courts at the Tennis Club in Eagles Ridge and two traditional hard courts immediately adjacent to the swimming pool. A resident pro provides private and group lessons, and there are leagues offered for all ages and skill levels.

It is easy to meet people and make friends in Golden Eagle. Low vehicle traffic and a 25 mph speed limit allow walkers, joggers, cyclists, dog-walkers and skate-boarders to be out and about throughout the day.

Retirees may be attracted to the golf course, tennis courts, and Country Club activities while younger residents might enjoy the community for its excellent school district. Killearn Lakes Elementary, Deerlake Middle, and Chiles High school are all "A" rated schools.

A traditional "Ladies Club" meets each month for lunch at the Country Club. A typical meeting will offer a local speaker on a topic of wide interest, and news of the various activities available at Golden Eagle – book clubs, card groups, volunteer work, gardening groups, dining groups and one-day field trips to local points of interest.

There are occasional parties for residents throughout the year including a golf cart parade and Block Party at Christmas. There are some open, communal areas by the lakes, but no designated playgrounds for children.

The active HOA offers Beautification, Architectural, Roads and Drainage, and Security Committees for residents interested in maintaining and improving the appearance and functions of the neighborhood.

There are about 500 homes, mostly brick, on lots about a half acre in size in the main section of Golden Eagle Plantation. Prices generally range from around \$400,000 to just over \$1,000,000.

Eagles Ridge is a more modest neighborhood within Golden Eagle, and it has homes starting in the low \$200's. So don't let your budget keep you away from all the fun! Come join us!

So we thought to ourselves, "where's all the traffic that many longtime residents warned us about?" Despite all the warnings, we reluctantly ventured out on Black Friday for some shopping.

Imagine our shock to find traffic light, and very few shoppers milling around. In Virginia, you practically have to pack your Thanksgivings meal in a carryout box and camp out at the mall just to get a parking spot!

In Tallahassee, there is very little traffic to deal with and did I mention how warm it is? You can wear shorts and flip flops to shop! It looks like these former residents of Northern Virginia made a great decision by moving here.

In 2014, we visited over 15 state parks and a myriad of museums, to include the Tallahassee Museum, Florida History Museum, and Tallahassee Automobile Museum. Did I mention we got to drive our 1931 Model A Ford in the Veterans Day Parade? It was amazing!

If you've never taken the boat ride at Wakulla Springs where alligators lounge by the water and ducks and migratory birds entertain you – we highly recommend it. Wakulla Springs is the deepest and largest fresh water springs in the world.

Add a tour of the Florida Caverns in Marianna to your must-do list. You will be in awe of the stalactite and stalagmite formations. Along with the natural beauty, there's even a wedding chapel in the caverns.



In Apalachicola, you'll find the Orman House, which was built in 1838 for the Thomas Orman family. He was a merchant and civic leader.

During our visit, we had a guided tour by a park ranger who was super and made you feel as though "he" lived there in the 1800s.

The park rangers are so knowledgeable about "their" park and are eager to share little known facts and history. We have found all the park rangers more than willing to enthusiastically discuss everything you may want to know about the park and surrounding area.

We love Tallahassee so far and I've saved the best for last. Did I mention that we have 2 year old grandson here and love to explore new things to share with him? :-)

If you enjoy bicycling, you've come to the right town. Tallahassee has a variety of trails with varying degrees of difficulty to match any cyclist's desire.

If dirt bikes are your passion:

<u>Maclay Gardens</u> has a large area of dirt trails that serve beginners and up. The <u>Fern Trail at Phipps Park</u> is also nice, but better suited for intermediate riders.

<u>Munson Hills</u>, dirt paths that feed from the St. Marks Trailhead just south of the intersection of Woodville Highway and Capital Circle SE is a lovely ride through the pine forests of Apalachicola National Forest.

If you recall last month's article about <u>Lafayette Heritage Trail Park</u>, you'd know that mountain bikes are a crowd favorite there as well.

For paved road enthusiasts, the St. Marks Trailhead also provides a nice jumping off point for the paved railroad bed that runs from Tallahassee to the water front town of St. Marks. With a full bathroom about halfway down the 32-mile road, the trail provides a great ride for cyclists of all skill levels.

For those living around the universities, a paved trail runs from west of FSU, south through FAMU and connects with the St. Marks Trail at Four Points, providing for a nice long ride for serious road riders.



The local cycling club, Capital City Cyclists, offers weekly rides of different distances and difficulties that introduce riders to the beautiful roads around town. They also sponsor the <u>Spaghetti</u> <u>100</u> each October.

Regardless of the distance ridden, everyone participates in a spaghetti dinner upon return to the starting point, thus the name!

Tallahassee cyclists are supported by a number of knowledgeable bicycle shops located about town with answers and repairs for any bicycle challenge. You have no excuse for not jumping on your bike and taking off!

For the nature lover: Piney Z

When you hear somebody say, "I live in Piney-Z," you might say to yourself, "I know where that is, but what the heck does Piney-Z mean?"

For those of you who are unfamiliar with the neighborhood, Piney-Z is a 700+ home development nestled between the award-winning Tom Brown Park, and Lafayette Heritage Trail Park in NE Tallahassee.

The neighborhood offers luxury single family houses, duplex townhomes, and carriage homes with excellent amenities. There's also a club house and community pool.

Spanish Moss, Magnolia, and other local foliage are commonplace and help the community maintain it's natural feel. A portion of the neighborhood borders on a bald eagle habitat, which has been the home to more than three generations of bald eagles since the mid-1990s.



Overall, Piney-Z residents appreciate the quiet atmosphere (only 3 entrances into the neighborhood) and the abundance of green space and convenience.

Piney-Z was developed on what was once a family-owned working plantation

in the mid-1800's. The family farmed, raised livestock, and even allowed local Boy Scout troops to camp and explore the lush landscape and lakes.



Today, Tallahassee natives that spent their youth in the Boy Scouts can recall fond memories of camping and hunting on the Piney-Z property. In the 1990's, the family owners of Piney-Z plantation finally agreed to sell the land for development.

Fortunately, developers working with community planners responsibly created the Piney-Z community and surrounding amenities.

The original home that occupied the plantation was converted into the "club house" and has been well preserved and maintained. Today, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, as well as ecological teams from Florida State and University of Western Florida study the wildlife and lakes located on the plantation.

If you're considering the purchase of a newer home with access to parks and wildlife, I highly recommend taking a drive through Piney-Z. I can guarantee that you won't be disappointed with what you find.
