A Leon County Schools Mentor can serve almost any age student from Kindergarten through Adult Education. After receiving training at the District Office or a school site, mentors work one-on-one with the same student each week.



Mentors can assist with academic assignments, check homework, help with test preparation, work on time management and goal-setting skills, check the student's assignment list regularly, and tutor the student.

Most importantly, mentors provide an additional caring adult for a student to look up to as a role model, and to be their friend.

A trained volunteer makes the commitment to assist an identified student one-on-one, for about one hour, once a week.

This is an outstanding opportunity to not only make a difference in our community, but to really have a lasting effect on the life of a child.

Want to spend less time on Facebook? Then delete the app from your phone. Logging in manually every time is way too much work!


Apply this concept to just about anything and form habits in 2016 to make it your happiest, most successful year yet!

As I sit here writing these words, I am looking at the forecasted weather for the upcoming Christmas holiday and it's going to be in the mid-80s! Yes it is warmer than usual, but I don't see people making much of a fuss over it.

As a native of Chicago I just can't get over the idea of walking the dog at night in shorts and a tee-shirt, and seeing Christmas decorations throughout the neighborhood homes.

I recently had the pleasure of making the long trek from Tallahassee to the Chicagoland area for the Thanksgiving Holiday. When I hopped in the car and departed Tallahassee it was a sunny, 79 degrees.

By the time I entered Southern Illinois, I was hit by one of the biggest November snowstorms in Illinois history. When I finally stepped out of my car 16 hours later in my hometown outside of Chicago, the outside air temperature was 9 degrees (and it actually felt colder
