50,000+)?


So yes we're hot, but watch out for the humidity.

A Little Tallahassee History Lesson

atherine Willis Grey was born of a privileged and loving family in Virginia. She happened to be the great grandniece of our nation's first president, George Washington.

After the untimely death of her first husband, Catherine met and married Prince Achille Murat, the nephew of Napoleon Bonaparte.

Catherine was often in court in England. She even attended the coronation of William IV of the United Kingdom and was given a seat in Westminster Abby.

In 1847, upon the death of her husband, Prince Murat, she inherited a 2000+ acre Lipona Plantation in Jefferson County. She later purchased Bellevue Plantation in Leon County and made It her home.



During the Civil War she was a member of the Soldiers Aid Societies and worked in a sewing circle that met to clothe Southern Troops. Unfortunately, she suffered considerable financial losses from her war efforts during that time.

But in 1866, after hearing of her hardships, her late husband's cousin, Napoleon II invited her to court in France to live the remainder of her days.

Catherine declined the invitation, and instead Napoleon II granted her annuity from the French government so that she could remain at home in Bellevue. Catherine Murat passed away in 1867.



This French princess was a very interesting woman. In fact, during the nation's first successful preservation effort, she was appointed the Vice Regent of Florida for her work involved in preserving George Washington's home in Mount Vernon.

Bellevue has since been relocated and is now a historical exhibit at the Tallahassee Museum. Take a weekend trip to visit the place and discover the rich history of the property for yourself.

Taking it one step further, Achille and Catherine Murat's grave sites can be visited at the St. John's Cemetery in the 400 block of W. Call St, along with a historical marker describing the life and legacy of Prince and Princess Murat.

Tallahassee history is pretty interesting after all. Class is now dismissed!

Oh, How Attractive!

Plorida State University has a reputation for big-time sports and its School of the Arts, but you might not know that The National High Magnetic Field Laboratory (MagLab) at FSU is a world-renown, high-tech science place where Sheldon, Leonard, Raj and Howard from The Big Bang Theory would fit right in.

That's right. Here in Tallahassee we have the largest and highest powered magnet lab in the world!



In 1989 FSU, Los Alamos National Laboratory, and the University of Florida submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation (NSF) for a new national laboratory supporting interdisciplinary research in high magnetic fields.

The plan proposed a federal-state partnership serving magnet-related research, science and technology education, and partnering industry.

The goal was to maintain the competitive position of the United States in magnet-related research and development. Following a peer-review competition, the NSF approved the FSU-led consortium's proposal over the proposal submitted by MIT to enlarge its existing facilities. Go Noles!

The laboratory's early years were spent establishing infrastructure, building the facility, and recruiting faculty. The Tallahassee complex was dedicated on October 1, 1994, to a large crowd, with keynote speaker Vice President Al Gore.

Today the MagLab continues to attract scientists from all over the world in disciplines that include physics, chemistry, materials science, engineering, biology and geology.

The National MagLab also conducts free public tours of the facility on the third Wednesday of each month at 11:30 a.m. No reservations are required for this standing tour; just show up wearing close-toed shoes and check in at the reception desk.

These tours include a general overview of the Magnet Lab and the research conducted here as well as explanations of the different types of magnets used, including resistive magnets, superconducting magnets, pulsed magnets and our world-record hybrid magnet.

You can also attend the annual Open House, held in February and free to the public. The "Hands On" experiences for all age groups demonstrate how exciting science can be.

You'll see such things as Tesla coils shooting sparks, melting rocks in the geochemistry group, and the measurement of the speed of sound. How cool is that?!

So come on out and enjoy all there is do at the MagLab. Who knows ... you might actually learn something.



bet you didn't know that Tallahassee has the only residence in Florida designed by the famous Frank Lloyd Wright, considered by many to be America's greatest architect.

Known today as the Spring House (named for the natural spring that flows from the property), and formerly owned by George Lewis II and his wife Clifton, it's located at 3117 Okeeheepkee Road in the Northwest quadrant of Tallahassee.

Spring House is a two-story home designed in the hemicycle style, which is important among Wright's designs in that it represents the last and chronologically shortest stylistic phase of his career.



Frank Lloyd Wright completed the plans for the home in 1952, and subsequently broke ground in April 1954.

By December 1954, construction was completed and the Lewis Family moved into their new home. They raised their four children in Spring House and received many prominent local, state, national, and international figures over the years.

Spring House was placed on the National Register of Historic Places

February 14, 1979 and George Lewis passed away in April 1996. His wife and others later formed the Spring House Institute, Inc., and charged it with the tasks of preserving the historic property and bringing it into beneficial public and private uses.



The Lewis family moved out of Spring House at the end of 2010 and Clifton passed away in February 2014.

The Mission of Spring House Institute is to acquire, restore and complete the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Spring House; to preserve its original architecture as a single-family dwelling for the benefit of the public as a teaching institute; and to foster the arts, environmental stewardship, social justice, and world peace.

Spring House will be used for a broad spectrum of classes, workshops, seminars, housing for visiting dignitaries, several overnight and weekend rentals, weddings, community meetings, and gatherings of all kinds.

How cool is it that the only house built in Florida by the greatest American architect of all time is located in our awesome little city? I think that's pretty cool myself.

Experience the Tallahassee Museum

E ver heard about the new rage called "Zip-Lining? Curious to try it but don't want to have to travel to a jungle in Borneo or some other far-flung place?

Grab your harness and safety gear because Tallahassee has its own zip-line adventure! Better still, this course runs through the tree tops in a cypress swamp, dangling you over alligators and giving you a unique perspective on the world!

Wonder where it's located? At a marvelous adventure spot known as the Tallahassee Museum!

The zip line has aerial games and a challenging obstacle course so participants know they have had an outstanding experience when they are finished.



Make sure to wear your walking shoes because the museum has a series of nature trails with native wildlife habitats and gardens dispersed throughout.

It also has an extensive collection of historic buildings, including Prince Murat's plantation home (Bellevue Plantation), and the Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church. Both are unique and interesting representations of life in northern Florida.

Should historic buildings not be your

forte, check out the *Introduction to Blacksmithing* or *Night Prowls* where you are guided through the dark to learn about the nocturnal behaviors of native wildlife.



Always seeking to provide their guests with unforgettable experiences, the museum sometimes keeps the zip line open at night ... what a thrill!

Established in 1963, it was originally named the *Tallahassee Junior Museum* to attract the younger crowd. Since that time, the activities have been greatly expanded to provide entertainment to people of all age groups.

It is rumored that it takes 2-3 hours to explore all that the museum has to offer. When you're ready for a break, check out the Trail Break Café for a refreshing drink or grab a bite to eat to replenish your energy.

The most popular event is *Market Days*, one of the largest juried arts and crafts shows in the southeast. This year it is scheduled for December 5-6, just in time for the Christmas holidays and a great place to shop for those who are tough to buy for.

So come on out and have a blast. The zip line is calling your name!

The ribs are only the tip of the iceberg when it comes to the amazing variety of






