
Jobs, Jobs, Jobs


There are vendors posted on every corner selling food and memorabilia. For those who are old enough to partake, there is no shortage of drinks to go around!



So today, I have complied a list of my favorite tailgating hacks to help calm those nerves and take your tailgating experience to the next level.

Tailgating Hack #5

Don't discard the container for the six pack you just bought. Repurpose it to hold your ketchup, mustard, mayo, barbeque sauce, relish, and hot sauce.

Opposites Always Attract!

ne of several best kept secrets in Tallahassee ... or maybe not so secret, is the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory (NHMFL) at FSU.

Known locally as the MagLab, it is capable of providing the means for some very diverse and significant research into a huge variety of scientific projects.

From its name you might think it is just a place to study magnets and magnetism. Oh, but it is so much more than that!

The scientists at the MagLab have received numerous awards for their work from around the world, to include the development of a powerful software to help better understand crude oil and uncovering the climate history of the planet Mars!

While many may have heard of the MagLab, few know what an enormous impact the lab has on the Tallahassee community and in Florida.

FSU teamed up with the University of Florida and the Los Alamos National Lab in New Mexico to bring the NHMFL to Tallahassee 25 years ago. Today, the lab employs about 750 people, 38% of which have PhD's from 50 different countries.

The total budget of the lab is about \$190 million. That sounds like a big number, but the bigger number is the return Florida gets on its investment ...

\$6.27 for every dollar we spend in that budget! The lab has the most powerful superconducting magnet in the world, and as you can imagine uses a good bit of electricity to run it.

But it's not all about experiments and the brilliant scientists working there, the MagLab provides a wealth of educational opportunities. Starting with K-12 students, they also offer classes for teachers, college students, beginning scientists, and the Tallahassee community at large.

One of the most popular events they hold is the lab's annual open house when they invite the public in to witness a variety of hands on activities designed to showcase the vast resources of the lab.

The 2015 Open House had over 5,500 attendees, demonstrating the increasing popularity of this wonderful resource.



The lab also offers tours to the public, you just need to call their main number to make arrangements.

If your child is showing interest in science or math, check out the <u>Magnet Academy</u> or you may even want to enroll them in the MagLab's extremely popular summer camp program.

Educational opportunities are seemingly endless in our wonderful city. Take advantage of them!

Remember how I said they keep it simple? Well, lunch consists of a small variety of fresh salads, cold sandwiches and melts.


And it's during the lunch hour that you'll come to truly understand why it's called "Freshroots Kitchen." It's all about the ingredients and the taste!

The order began in 1868 when a group of minstrel show performers, called the "Jolly Corks," gathered on Sundays with the expressed intent of circumnavigating New York City laws restricting the opening hours of its taverns.

They fostered a contagious enthusiasm for enjoying each other's company which fueled their unavoidable habit of entertaining each other with readings, recitals, acts, plays, and songs.

When one of their members passed away, his wife and children were left without income. It was then that the Jolly Corks club decided to add other service roles, rituals, and a new name.

The choice was between the elk and the buffalo. They wanted to identify with a readily identifiable creature of stature, indigenous to America.

The elk was favored by one vote! From these merry beginnings this all-American club of performers would resolve to become the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks.

Elks are all about the family, their children, and honoring America's

veterans.

With a unique focus on service and gratitude, the Order of Elks has become one of the largest providers of academic scholarships in the U.S., and one of its most staunch supporters of our men and women in uniform. In fact, the Elks adopted mandatory observance of Flag



Day by every Lodge in 1911, and it remains a requirement today.

The public nature and orientation of the Elks make it an easy opportunity to participate in its charitable efforts and services without becoming a member. For example, the Tallahassee Elks Lodge on Magnolia Drive hosts a function nearly every day of the week, which usually includes food!

Mondays are burger nights: Wednesdays are BINGO nights, and food is made available. Thursdays are formal lunch in the afternoons and then tournament at night. Fridays are formal dinner and Karaoke afterwards and Saturday is devoted to college football, when in season and everything that comes with it!
