

Wakulla Springs Awaits You!

A s our temperatures warm up this spring, start planning your outdoor activities in and around the greater Tallahassee area!

Wakulla Springs State Park and Lodge is a well know destination in these parts. Built in 1937 by financier Edward Ball, it is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and designated as a National Natural Landmark.

This park is home to one of the largest and deepest freshwater springs in the world and sees approximately 200,000 visitors each year.

Guests can enjoy the refreshing 70 degree temperature of the springs year round which is especially welcome in the hot summer months! In addition to enjoying the beach-like swimming atmosphere, guided boat tours are available which give visitors the opportunity to view the abundant wildlife and beautiful landscape of the Wakulla River.

Other features of the park include picnic areas, hiking/nature trails, horse trails, playground, bird/wildlife watching, and the Lodge, which is available to overnight guests as well as event hosting of weddings, parties and meetings.

Another wonderful way to enjoy the Wakulla River outside of the Wakulla Springs State Park is by taking a canoe or kayak adventure!

You can bring your own water craft or rent at various locations nearby. One option is <u>T-n-T Hide-A-Way Canoe and</u> <u>Kayak Rental</u> off Highway 98 in Crawfordville. Just park your car, and launch right into the river.

From there, your adventure takes you upstream for a fairly easy paddle. You can take your journey and return back at your leisure or reach the final turnaround at 6 miles from the launch with a relaxing float back downstream.

If you would like a more full service experience, visit <u>The Wilderness Way</u> on Shadeville Road in Crawfordville. They offer guided tours with experienced paddlers knowledgeable about the history and ecology of the region.



In addition to rentals, they carry the largest selection of kayaks for sale in the Big Bend area. So if you find that your paddling adventure has got you hooked, The Wilderness Way can help you select the right craft just for you!

Next time you are looking for an amazing local day trip, a paddling journey down the Wakulla River should be added to your list. It really makes for a great weekend getaway with the family.

Just make sure you remember to bring your camera for some awesome nature and wildlife pics! And last but definitely not least ... Don't forget to wear sunscreen.

Discover A.J. Henry Park

This month's Exploration Series feature zeros-in on the peaceful and nicely shaded AJ Henry Park. This 72 -acre tract is centrally located amidst seven surrounding neighborhoods in the Killearn area, and was developed as an active and passive park.

In March of 1985, the City acquired the land for the park and named it A. J. Henry in memory of the property owner who donated the land to the City, Dr. Joe Henry.

The City developed the first phase of A. J. Henry Park with some funding from the Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program in 1986. This stage included picnic facilities, a playground and open playing space, and nature and walking trails.




Future plans promised the residents construction of a community center and swimming pool. Site improvements include four picnic shelters, a large picnic pavilion, a comfort station, and parking areas.

AJ Henry Park is a great place for little kid birthday parties. It's not as busy as Tom Brown Park and the pavilions and restrooms are very close to the playground, so you can keep a close eye

on your little ones.

If you have a toddler and get nervous about the "big kids" racing after each other through the playground completely unaware of someone half their size, then you will love the slow, calm pace that AJ Henry Park has to offer.



There is also a good amount of tree cover to help keep you cool on those hot summer days. A 1.3 mile trail gives you the opportunity to explore the entirety of the park while getting some fresh air and healthy exercise in the process.

You can access AJ Henry Park by taking Centerville Road to Gardenview and then Gardenview to AJ Henry Park Drive or you can take Thomasville North to Killarney Way and then Killarney Way to Shamrock and then Shamrock to Gardenview and Gardenview to AJ Henry Park Drive. Parking is easy to find near the park entrance.

Why Wait?! Get To The Beach!

Reeling house bound? Cold weather and gloomy skies getting to you? Dreaming of the beach, thinking it's still three to four months before you can throw the kids in the car and head to sand and surf again?

Perhaps there's another option ... one that gets you out of the house and down to the shore giving you the quiet experience of the beach without the masses of people, screaming kids and constantly looking for a spot for your towel and umbrella.



Have you ever been to the beach in late winter or very early spring? What a wonderful experience it can be. Especially if you pick a location that during the more popular times of year is packed with people.

The Florida panhandle has some of the prettiest beaches in the world, repeatedly chosen among the top 10 in the US. And our beaches have some unique features that add to the coastal retreat experience.

For example, Walton County has two state parks that cover 6 miles of white sand beach totally undeveloped and protected for your enjoyment.

County Road 30A runs along the water front from Topsail Hill Preserve State Park to Rosemary Beach where it intersects with Hwy 98.

The county also built a 20-mile paved bike and walking path water-ward of 30A that takes you along the beach, over wooden bridges and through lovely beach side communities like Seaside and Watercolors.

What better time to ride those 20 miles than in a comfortable sweatshirt on a cool day with the road wide open ahead of you!

Each of the towns has unique choices for overnight accommodations. Starting with the two state parks along the shore, Topsail Hill Preserve State Park provides RV campsites at the park while Grayton Beach Dunes State Park has wonderful cabins for rent but you'll need to make those reservations ahead of time.

You'll find more upscale accommodations and a great beach experience in <u>Seaside</u>. There are lots of unique cottages scattered upland from the beach.

And you may even recognize the town as it was the backdrop for the movie, *The Truman Show*. Delightfully designed and decorated, these cottages provide the perfect place to relax for your beach vacation as you grab a light blanket and a mug of hot chocolate and put your feet up in front of the fire.

So as you start to think about things to do as the weather warms, don't forget about all the possibilities just a short drive away at one of our beaches.
